

Oregon Country Fair is Back!

Oregon Country Fair (OCF), the magical assemblage of free spirits and merry makers, is described on their website as "an annual three-day festival in the woods of Veneta, Oregon offering the finest in entertainment, hand-made crafts, delectable food and information sharing, with annual attendance of approximately 45,000."

The Fair is back this year from July 8-10, 2022, after having to cancel the 2020 Fair and go virtual in 2021.

From the bubbly mind of Tom Noddy, a little bit of the history of OCF and its connection to the founding of Moisture Festival...

"In the late 1970s and into the '80s and '90s, a number of street performers came to see themselves as having a spiritual connection to the Vaudevillians of old. A handful of us on the West Coast would see each other semi-regularly at San Francisco's Fisherman's Wharf, Portland's Saturday Market, and Seattle's Pike Place Market. Our mini gatherings were short but valuable, and we longed for some place where we could hang together for more than a few hours.

Reverend Chumleigh and the Flying Karamazov Brothers had taken to attending the annual crafts fair out in the countryside near Eugene, Oregon, and when they told tales to others we made our way there too: Magical Mystical Michael, myself, Baby Gramps, Roberto Morganti, Moz Wright, Avner the Eccentric, Artis the Spoonman, Charlie Brown, Ron Bailey, and more: jugglers, sword swallowers, puppeteers, eccentric clowns and musicians.

Oregon Country Fair became the one place that we all knew we could find each other year after year. We did separate shows and at night we did combined shows. We built Vaudeville stages, and, to attract audiences to them, we formed up parades and sometimes raided other stages during their shows. We ate and showered and "sauna'd" together and formed new acts together.

And then...we widened the base. We were inspired by similar efforts, like Hacki Ginda's Comedy Varieté festival in Berlin, Germany at "The Chameleon." What we saw was a model that just might help us bring the same crowd together at a different time of year and ... in 2004, from the energy shared at the Oregon Country Fair in the summertime, we launched the springtime Moisture Festival in Seattle.
