
Moisture Festival is being held at Broadway Performance Hall in Seattle.



The Broadway Performance Hall doors will open 1 hour before the performance is scheduled to start. The auditorium (the room with your seats) will open approximately 30 minutes before the performance starts.

Before the show the lobby area might be crowded and/or noisy with other people waiting to get into the performance.

When you arrive at the theatre you will need to get your **ticket checked**. Our ticket takers will scan the barcode on your ticket, whether it is printed or on your phone screen. If you lost your ticket, we can look up your booking at the Box Office. Just give the Box Office Manager the name you booked with.








Ticket Checking


If you don't have a pre-purchased ticket you can go to the box office to get your ticket.

In the lower lobby you can get pictures taken, find the Gender-Neutral restrooms, or head to the upper lobby.



If stairs aren't accessible for you there is an elevator to help you travel between floors.

In the upper lobby you can buy concessions, merch, and find Gendered restrooms.




If you have any questions or need any help you can find staff members who are willing to help you. The staff members who check your tickets and help you find your seats are called ushers.

Auditorium





The Auditorium is the part of the theater where you sit when you are watching the performance.

There are three different sections in the auditorium, divided by two aisles. **There will be time before the show starts for you to find/choose your seats.**



The Stage is the place where the performance will happen.



If you are sitting in an aisle seat, please be aware that some performers will walk/run in the aisles throughout the show. During sold out shows ushers may ask people to move closer together so that seats in the middle of a row are not left empty.



Lighting & Sound

Once you are seated the lights may begin to dim and turn off do not be alarmed: this signals the beginning of the performance.



In the middle of the performance there will be an intermission when you can get up and use the restroom, stretch your legs, and buy concessions. A bell will ring to signal the intermission is ending and you should return to your seats for the second half of the show.


You are free to leave the auditorium at any time, but you may need to wait until an appropriate time to get back to your seat.

There may be sounds effects or moments in music that can be loud or surprising. If you are sensitive to sound you are more than welcome to wear sound blockers if you have brought them with you.


Post show
